6. Resolve the conflict. The of the story should provide a satisfying resolution to the conflict.
7. Use a twist ending. A twist ending is a surprising or unexpected to the story.
8. Keep it short. A spooky short story for kids should be between 500 and 1,000 words long.
9. Use simple language. The story should be easy for kids to understand.
